Dear Parents and Carers,

Heritage and Diversity Week:

The children have had a very exciting week with lots of creative and inspiring activities planned by their class teachers. I know that lots of learning has been shared on Class dojo for parents to view. Below is a short summary of the countries that each class has been studying and some of the learning they have been engaging in. A particular highlight has been Contract Dining Company's special menu's where the children had the opportunity to try food from the countries they have been studying.

Year 6 – St Francis' class have had an incredible week diving into Mexican culture! They have created some wonderful artwork based on the Day of the Dead festival including papel picado, tissue paper marigolds and have even created 3D calacas out of paper and clay. They have explored the work of Frida Khalo and have created their own recipe books for making Mexican empanadas. They have learnt about Pedro Linares, who designed alebrijes and even made their own Mexican worry dolls. Year 6 even had they had the chance to prepare their own Tres leches cake which they were able to take home. As well as all of this, they even took part in the Mexican Hat Dance. It has been a wonderful week and I hope all of year 6 enjoyed their learning.

Year 5 - This week Year 5 have studied Japan through various different means: by exploring the similarities and differences between the UK and Japan; creating work related to the festival of Tanabata and traditional Kokeshi dolls; examining the main religious beliefs of Japanese people; writing Haiku poetry and manga storytelling based around the motorsport of drift racing; making vegetarian Sushi; using google maps to explore and identify specific locations; finishing our computing term with vector drawings of iconic Japanese imagery; and learning the history of Nintendo, placing these cultural events into a historical timeline of the company.

Year 4 - Year 4 have been looking at Brilliant Brazil! We have had a really wonderful week celebrating carnival! The children have created their own carnival masks and we had carnival around the school to show off all of our hard work to the rest of the school. We even got to make some Brazilian cheese bread (Pão de Queijo). We have also looked at the Christ The Redeemer statue in Rio De Janeiro and then created our own. We have had a really wonderful week and the children have really enjoyed themselves and really embraced the Brazilian culture!

Year 3 - This week we have visited India as part of our celebration of diversity! We began the week by visiting a local Gurdwara and learning so much about the Sikh religion. We were made to feel so welcome and enjoyed finding out about the 5k's. On our return to school, we were very creative and sewed some very beautiful Indian elephants, we cooked and tried some Indian dips with poppadoms, found out about the wildlife, explored maps and created henna and rangoli art. Gabby told me that, "she really loved all of the henna and the art". Jawson felt, "that the food was very tasty". What an amazing week!

Year 2 – Year 2 have been learning about Jamaica this week. At the start of the week, we had an Afrobeats dance lesson which we thoroughly enjoyed! We have discovered lots of information about human and physical features of Jamaica as well as some of the fruit that can grow there because of the tropical climate. We have learnt about the Olympic champion, Usain Bolt and then challenged ourselves to see how many times we could complete a movement in 9.54 seconds. Reggae music has been the soundtrack to our week! We have listened to some popular songs from Bob Marley and used percussion instruments to play along to the beat. We created some Bob Marley art work in the style of 'pop art' and we also used different materials to create a swallow tail hummingbird, which is native to Jamaica.

Year 1 - Bonjour! This week in Year 1 we have been finding out all about France. We have been learning some basic French vocabulary and phrases such as how to say our name, the numbers and colours. We have been creating our own pieces of artwork inspired by the French artists Claude Monet and Georges Seurat using paint. We have also been creating our own exciting adventures for Traction Man and Scrubbing Brush in Paris, and have produced comic strips to illustrate those













adventures. Finally, we have ended our week with our very own Tour de SWOP, racing on the balance bikes in our house teams.

Year R - This week St John's Class have been learning all about China and celebrating Chinese New Year. We learnt and acted out 'The Great Race' that began the very first Chinese New Year, this year it is the year of the snake! We have made traditional chinese fans, repeating pattern snakes and Chinese flags. We have also tasted some delicious food including noodles, egg fried rice, prawn crackers and fortune cookies. We have even created some Chinese music and danced a Chinese lion dance. We have also been answering the register by saying 'Nǐ hǎo'

Year 3 Class Trip - Medway Gurdwara

The children asked lots of fascinating questions and were very well behaved. Afterwards they were treated to squash and biscuits. I would like to pass on my gratitude to the Gurdwara for allowing us to visit and for their wonderful hospitality.

Year 2 Class Assembly – Friday 7th February

St. Therese's class led us in prayer this morning. The focus of their assembly was the importance of diversity in our world. They acted out the story of the good Samaritan and explored the meaning of this important parable. We also really enjoyed their singing of Bob Marley's song "Three Little Birds – Don't worry about a thing" from their diversity week learning about Jamaica.

<u>Healthy Eating</u>: May we politely remind you that chocolate bars / sweets etc. are not to be included in home packed lunches please. <u>SWOP is a NUT FREE ZONE</u>: Some of our children have severe nut allergies so it is very important that pupils' packed lunches <u>should not contain any nuts or nut products</u> – thank you.













<u>Absence</u>: If your child is absent from school, please contact the school office by telephone or email using <u>absence@stwilliamperth.medway.sch.uk</u> before 9:30 am on the first morning of absence. Should your child continue to be absent from school on the third day, parents must re contact the school. When your child returns to school, if you have not already emailed their reason for absence, please also send a written note to school with your child giving the reason for your child's absence so that the absence can be authorised and the reason for the absence noted on your child's school record. Please do not put this information in the contact book.

Attendance: St. William of Perth is committed to ensuring all children achieve their full academic potential and believe that good attendance means good learning. The positive impact that regular attendance has on a child reaching their full academic potential and the benefits this brings to emotional and social well-being. The school's expectation for pupil's attendance is at least 96%. If your child is too unwell to attend school in the morning, it is encouraged that if they are able to and feel well enough, to come into school later in the day to attend for the afternoon session to reduce the learning missed. Likewise, if your child is unwell and you are unsure whether to send them in, please do so. The children tend to perk up during the day and if they get too unwell to be at school, we will contact parents / carers to advise to collect.

<u>Application for Leave of Absence / Exceptional Circumstances</u>

As parents, you have a legal responsibility to ensure your child's attendance at school. Holidays should be taken during the school holiday period. During the academic year pupils are at school for 190 days and at home for 175 days. In order for our children to fully utilise their years in education, we believe it is vital that every message they receive reinforces the importance of school. Holidays in term time interrupt continuity of teaching and learning, disrupt the educational progress of individual children and create disruption to classes.

Please be aware that the statutory DfE Working Together to Improve School Attendance 2024 and The Education (Penalty Notices) (England) Regulations 2024, state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

All requests should be made well in advance, in writing. You will then be asked to complete an Application for Leave of Absence / Exceptional Circumstances form and will be invited to discuss your request with either myself or in my absence Mrs Tong.

<u>PE</u>: All children must have a P.E. kit, named in a school plimsoll bag to be left at school until the end of term. Children cannot do P.E. if wearing earrings so please make sure they are removed for their P.E. day or are able to remove them without adult assistance. SWOP P.E. tops and plimsoll bags are available to purchase from the school office.

Please ensure all PE kits are in school as PE is very important in helping us promote healthy lifestyles!!

To avoid congestion at the school office, we ask that all uniform orders are placed via email to office@stwilliamperth.medway.sch.uk We will advise by return of email, stock availability and the cost of your order.

<u>Phoning Home for Forgotten Items</u>: Please remind your child that usually the office will not be phoning parents if they forget to bring items such as, swimming kit, book bags, musical instruments etc., so they need to check they have everything ready for school before they leave home!
