Message from Our Headteacher

Welcome to "Prayers for Home" - we hope that you will enjoy praying with your children at home as much as we do within our school community.

We believe that prayer is a shared experience, a conversation with God and that we all have our own way for "talking and listening to God". There is no "right" way to pray!

We believe that the traditional prayers that are said regularly in our school parish community are important to pass on to our children. Please help your child to become familiar with them and enjoy the experience of praying together at home.

The Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

Actions to teach your child—with their right hand (touch forehead) - In the name of the Father, (touch heart) and of the Son (touch left shoulder) and of the Holy (touch right shoulder) Spirit (join your hands) Amen

You may wish to teach your child an alternative sign of the cross (We use this in Key Stage 1):

From my head to my heart, from my shoulder to my shoulder, I belong to God my Father.

Spontaneous Prayers:

In addition to the traditional prayers that we say in school, we use everyday situations to "talk to God". For example, during the day we encourage children to say thank you to God. Thank you God for a lovely day, thank you God for m family, thank you God for ...
